Role Overview

The Families, Children and Youth Ministry Facilitator promotes and supports the growth of family, children and youth ministries within the Diocese of Adelaide. This includes fostering community connections and advocating for youth, aligned with the Diocesan Vision.

The position works in collaboration with the School Chaplaincy team, Schools Liaison Officer, Flourishing Communities Facilitator, Synod Office, Coordinator of Education Programs, parishes, clergy, and lay members in the Diocese.

Key Responsibilities

- Promote and support the growth of family, children, and youth ministries in parishes.
- Survey current ministries in the Diocese and identify needs and opportunities.
- Build connections and collaboration between current and new initiatives within the Diocese.
- Advocate for the ministry needs of children, youth and families in church and school communities and identify opportunities.
- Represent youth perspectives within the Diocese
- Encourage and facilitate the provision of ministry training and resources in collaboration with youth and children's ministry leaders.
- Provide guidance and facilitate pastoral care and support to ministry volunteers.
- Share safe ministry procedures and guidelines with ministry participants.
- Provide regular reports and presentations to relevant stakeholders, committees, and governing bodies
- Additional duties as required.

Person Specification

The ideal candidate for the position should possess the following qualifications, attributes and skills:

- Qualifications or experience in Pastoral Care, Early Childhood Education, Youth Work, Theology, or similar.
- Mature Christian faith and commitment.
- Proven leadership in children and youth ministry within a church context.
- Passion for safe, inclusive ministry environments.
- Team player with leadership skills.
- Experience working with and motivating volunteers.
- Active member of the Anglican Church or another Christian community.
- Hold First Aid and Mental Health First Aid certificates (or be willing to obtain)



Other Requirements

The successful applicant will:

- hold or be willing to obtain a safe ministry clearance as required by the Diocese's
 Safe Ministry screening process for church workers
- conform to all conditions of appointment, organisational policies and procedures
- be prepared to travel both intra and interstate as required
- work flexibly, including some weekends and evenings
- hold a current driver's license
- be based at the Anglican Diocese of Adelaide offices, with regular off-site work
